### **Course Description**

#### Course overview:

Hindi 4 is designed to be a project based course.

Students will learn about the prevalent social and socio-economic issues of our society and the Hindi speaking world like female foeticide, dowry system, and child abuse in the target language, A list is added at the end of this document. In a given year, students and teachers can pick 5-6 issues from the list to learn about the issue, and work on a project to raise the awareness of it among the Hindi speaking community.

Students will use available resources (videos and articles in the target language). Students and the teacher will generate a list of questions related to the issue. Some suggestions are given in this document.

Students will discuss possible ways to create awareness of these issues in the target language and possible solutions.

As a class project, students will work in a group to create a video or publish an article in the target language, to promote awareness of the selected issue.

This class is structured to emphasize all four aspects of language learning: reading, writing, speaking, listening. This level is designed to further develop and strengthen Hindi grammar and communication skills.

Students will engage in many interpretive, interpersonal and presentational modes of communication in Hindi, representing real-life situations. All class discussions will be conducted in the target language.
